## The Message: God's Plan of Salvation

In trying to lead a person to the Lord please remember that this person needs to understand the plan of salvation and nothing else until after he is saved.

- (I Cor. 2:14) The unsaved cannot really grasp spiritual teachings because they are not born again and do not have the Holy Spirit within to teach them these things.
- (John 16:7-11) God wants the unsaved to trust Christ as their Saviour, and will help them
  understand the verses on the plan of salvation. Wait until the person is saved before you start
  talking about service or any so-called "deeper" truths.
- (I Cor. 14:40) Do things in order. As you explain the plan of salvation to someone you will be sensitive to notice which areas he needs to have dealt with at some length. First we will cover the doctrine, then we will discuss the presentation, throughout most of this book.

**DOCTRINE #1 - Everyone is a sinner, less perfect than God.** If you compare your life with that of those around you, you might feel you are a good person; But when you compare even your best qualities with those of the Almighty God, you will see that you are not as perfect as God. Nobody is. One word God uses when He says we "sin" is "hamartano" in the Greek, and means to "miss the mark". We miss the mark of God's perfection.

- 1. (Rom. 3:23). "For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God" The Virgin Mary, the Pope, your minister, your mother, you and I...all are sinners."
- 2. " (Ecc. 7:20)."For there is not a just man .....that doeth good and sinneth not".
- 3. (Isa. 64:6) "But we are all as an unclean thing, and all our righteousnesses are as filthy rags; and we all do fade as a leaf; and our iniquities, like the wind, have taken us away"

### **PRESENTATION -**

- 1. Be careful how you point out the person is a sinner.
  - a. Admit you are, and he will be willing to admit he is. An effective statement is, "God says everyone is a sinner...I am, you are, we all are."
  - b. If you happen to know that the person is very moral, compliment him, but show that he still isn't perfect in God's sight (Isa. 64:6, James 2:10).
- 2. Never act like, or imply that, we are "holy" because of personal righteousness, neither is it wise to go to the other extreme. Don't tell him your past (or present) sins. Don't use phrases like, "I used to be a sinner, but now I am saved."
- 3. Sometimes a person will feel he is too great a sinner for Christ to save him. An effective statement is, "God cannot save a good person!" (Rom 3:12.) If God can save the chief he can save the Indians. (I Tim. 1:15). Move on to the next thing you want him to see in the Bible.

**ALWAYS keep the issue between the Bible and him** and not between you and him. The issue isn't that you have the answers, but that God has the answers.

- 3. (I Cor. 14:40) Do things in order. As you explain the plan of salvation to someone you will be sensitive to notice which areas he needs to have dealt with at some length. First we will cover the doctrine, then we will discuss the presentation, throughout most of this book.

**DOCTRINE #1 - Everyone is a sinner, less perfect than God.** If you compare your life with that of those around you, you might feel you are a good person; But when you compare even your best qualities with those of the Almighty God, you will see that you are not as perfect as God. Nobody is. One word God uses when He says we "sin" is "hamartano" in the Greek, and means to "miss the mark". We miss the mark of God's perfection.

- 1. (Rom. 3:23). "For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God" The Virgin Mary, the Pope, your minister, your mother, you and I...all are sinners."
- 2. " (Ecc. 7:20)."For there is not a just man .....that doeth good and sinneth not".
- 3. (Isa. 64:6) "But we are all as an unclean thing, and all our righteousnesses are as filthy rags; and we all do fade as a leaf; and our iniquities, like the wind, have taken us away"

### **PRESENTATION -**

- 1. Be careful how you point out the person is a sinner.
  - a. Admit you are, and he will be willing to admit he is. An effective statement is, "God says everyone is a sinner...I am, you are, we all are."
  - b. If you happen to know that the person is very moral, compliment him, but show that he still isn't perfect in God's sight (Isa. 64:6, James 2:10).
- 2. Never act like, or imply that, we are "holy" because of personal righteousness, neither is it wise to go to the other extreme. Don't tell him your past (or present) sins. Don't use phrases like, "I used to be a sinner, but now I am saved."
- 3. Sometimes a person will feel he is too great a sinner for Christ to save him. An effective statement is, "God cannot save a good person!" (Rom 3:12.) If God can save the chief he can save the Indians. (I Tim. 1:15). Move on to the next thing you want him to see in the Bible.

**ALWAYS** keep the issue between the Bible and him and not between you and him. The issue isn't that you have the answers, but that God has the answers.

**DOCTRINE #2- The result and penalty of sin is death...** separation from God.

- 1. (Rom. 6:23). "For the wages of sin is death..." The payment for sin is death. Sin is not paid for by good works, penance, church membership, water baptism, etc. Sin is paid for by death.
- 2. (Isa. 59:2)**God does not hate the sinner**, but He hates the sin. He hates sin because it separates us from Him.
- 3. (II Thess. 1:8,9) People who sin, **must be punished**. "

CHAPTER I

In flaming fire taking **vengeance** on them that know not God and that obey not the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ: Who shall be **punished** with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of His power" Except for those taken in the Rapture, everyone will die physically. The body goes back to dust, and the soul goes to heaven or hell. Everyone is born dead spiritually (Eph. 2:1). Christ said in John 3:7, "...Ye must be born again." Only through a new birth of the Spirit can man have eternal life. If a person dies without Christ, his soul will be separated from God and he will be cast into the lake of fire ...(Rev. 20:14,15).

**PRESENTATION** - For most people, a simple statement on this point is sufficient, as: "God loves us but hates our sin, because the payment for sin is death and separation from Him." When you do not sense resistance on this point (and you usually won't), move on to what you want to cover next.

**DOCTRINE - #3** Not only is God perfect, but the eternal heaven is also a perfect place. No sin could enter this heaven. Man must be perfectly righteous to go to heaven.

- 1. (II Peter 3:13)."Nevertheless we, according to His promise, look for new heavens and a new earth, wherein dwelleth righteousness"
- 2. (Rev. 21:27). "And there shall in no wise enter into it anything that defileth, neither whatsoever worketh abomination, or maketh a lie:..."
- 3. (Psalm 5:4) "For thou art not a God that hath pleasure in wickedness: neither shall evil dwell with thee"

It is God's heaven. He created it (Gen 1:1). He lives in it (Psalm 11:4; 115:3). He says there will be no tears, sorrow, pain or death in heaven (Rev. 21:4), and God has the right to say who will go there. If any sin were allowed into heaven, death would be there.

Not only are we sinners and need our sin paid for before we can enter heaven, but this body we have could never live forever anyway. It will get old, sickly, and die. God not only offers a payment for your sin, but He also will give you a new, glorified body that will live forever, entirely free from sin, sickness, and death. It will be like the glorified body of our Lord Jesus Christ (Phil. 3:21; I John 3:2).

**PRESENTATION** - When a person sees that he is a sinner and that with his sin he cannot enter heaven, he will be ready for the next point. Usually a statement like "Heaven is a perfect place, and no sin can enter heaven because sin would bring death" will be sufficient.

CHAPTER I

In flaming fire taking **vengeance** on them that know not God and that obey not the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ: Who shall be **punished** with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of His power" Except for those taken in the Rapture, everyone will die physically. The body goes back to dust, and the soul goes to heaven or hell. Everyone is born dead spiritually (Eph. 2:1). Christ said in John 3:7, "...Ye must be born again." Only through a new birth of the Spirit can man have eternal life. If a person dies without Christ, his soul will be separated from God and he will be cast into the lake of fire ...(Rev. 20:14,15).

**PRESENTATION** - For most people, a simple statement on this point is sufficient, as: "God loves us but hates our sin, because the payment for sin is death and separation from Him." When you do not sense resistance on this point (and you usually won't), move on to what you want to cover next.

**DOCTRINE - #3** Not only is God perfect, but the eternal heaven is also a perfect place. No sin could enter this heaven. Man must be perfectly righteous to go to heaven.

- 1. (II Peter 3:13)."Nevertheless we, according to His promise, look for new heavens and a new earth, wherein dwelleth righteousness"
- 2. (Rev. 21:27). "And there shall in no wise enter into it anything that defileth, neither whatsoever worketh abomination, or maketh a lie:..."
- 3. (Psalm 5:4) "For thou art not a God that hath pleasure in wickedness: neither shall evil dwell with thee"

It is God's heaven. He created it (Gen 1:1). He lives in it (Psalm 11:4; 115:3). He says there will be no tears, sorrow, pain or death in heaven (Rev. 21:4), and God has the right to say who will go there. If any sin were allowed into heaven, death would be there.

Not only are we sinners and need our sin paid for before we can enter heaven, but this body we have could never live forever anyway. It will get old, sickly, and die. God not only offers a payment for your sin, but He also will give you a new, glorified body that will live forever, entirely free from sin, sickness, and death. It will be like the glorified body of our Lord Jesus Christ (Phil. 3:21; I John 3:2).

**PRESENTATION** - When a person sees that he is a sinner and that with his sin he cannot enter heaven, he will be ready for the next point. Usually a statement like "Heaven is a perfect place, and no sin can enter heaven because sin would bring death" will be sufficient.

### DOCTRINE - #4 Nothing man could do could save him or help save him.

That a person cannot save himself by his works...or help Christ to save him by his works...or help keep himself saved by his works, will be one of the most difficult things for a person to believe. If anything is clear in Scripture, it is that man is saved by his faith in Christ alone.

- 1. (Eph. 2:8,9) "For by grace are ye saved ... Not of works, lest any man should boast".
- 2. (Rom. 4:5) "But to him that worketh not, but believeth ..."
- 3. (Gal 2:16). 'Knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law...."
- 4. (Titus 3:5)"Not by works of righteousness which we have done....."
- 5. (Rom. 3:28) "...we CONCLUDE that a man is JUSTIFIED BY FAITH..."

(II Cor. 11:14,15) Religions are man made. Two Latin words make up our English word "religion;" "re" and "ligio." "Re" means to "go back," and "ligio" means "to bind." "Religion" then means "to bind back." Religions are man's efforts to bind himself back to God. The plan of salvation is not a religion but is the message of what God has **already done** to bring us back to Him. Satan gives the lost a religion that, when he hears it, will blind him to salvation. He offers them a "heavenly" way to go to hell. When you witness, always point out that the GOSPEL is NOT a "religion.". While you do believe in the freedom of worship without persecution, point out that all the religious leaders of the world are dead, but the Lord Jesus Christ is alive!

GOOD WORKS FOR SALVATION IS SATAN'S COUNTERFEIT OF GOD'S GRACE FOR SALVATION. THIS ISSUE OF "GRACE versus WORKS" WILL ALMOST ALWAYS BE THE MAIN THING YOU WILL NEED TO DEAL WITH.

- (Rom. 11:6)."And if by grace, then is it no more of works: otherwise grace is no more grace.
   But if it be of works, then is it no more grace: otherwise work is no more work"
- 2. Matt. 7:21-23, "Not every one that saith unto Me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of My Father (I Tim. 2:3, 4) which is in heaven. Many will say to Me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Thy Name? And in Thy Name have cast out devils? And in Thy Name done many WONDERFUL WORKS? And then I will profess unto them, I NEVER knew you; depart from Me, ye that work INIQUITY."

# **DOCTRINE - #5** Christ made a complete payment for all sin and offers His righteousness.

- 1. (II Cor. 5:21) "For He (God) hath made Him (Christ) **to be sin for us**, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in Him". Christ never sinned. He lived a perfect life. He took our sins upon Himself, paid for them, that He might give us God's righteousness.
- (Isa. 53:6) "All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord hath laid on Him the iniquity of us all". God allowed Christ to take our sin upon Himself and pay for it ALL.
- 3. (I Peter 3:18)"For Christ also hath once suffered for sins, the **Just for the unjust**, that He might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh, but quickened by the Spirit". Christ was the Just that died for the unjust, so that we could live forever in heaven with the Lord.
- 4. (I Peter 2:24) "Who His own self bare our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed". Jesus paid for our sins by Himself. He needed no help. We are made whole because He took our punishment.
- 5. (Col. 2:13, 14) "And you, being dead in your sins and the uncircumcision of your flesh, hath He quickened together with Him, having forgiven you all trespasses; blotting out the handwriting of ordinances that was against us...and took it out of the way, nailing it to His cross". He then forgave you all trespasses. He can forgive us because He took all our sins and paid for them.
- 6. (Titus 2:14) "Who gave Himself for us, that He might redeem us from all iniquity..."
- 7. (Acts 13:38, 39) "Be it known unto you therefore, men and brethren, that through this Man is preached unto you the forgiveness of sins: And by Him all that believe are justified from all things, from which ye could not be justified by the law of Moses" Keeping the law could not save you. But Christ paid for all sin; so, if you believe in Him, He will forgive you and justify you from all the wrong you have done.
- 8. (Heb 10:10,14) "By the which will we are sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ, once for all. For by one offering He hath perfected forever them that are sanctified". It is God's will that we are made pure and holy because Jesus offered Himself for our sins. His ONE payment was sufficient for all sins, of all time, for all people. By this ONE offering we who believe are made perfect forever. We are pure and holy through His death.
- 9. (Rom. 4:25) Had Christ not fully paid for all sin, we could not receive justification and He would not have come back from the dead Since the payment for sin is death, He would still be in that grave. But Christ is risen from the dead, proving God is satisfied with the payment for sin that Christ made.

Who is guilty of His death? Jesus Himself told us no man TOOK His life. Listen to His words, "...I lay down My life, that I might take it again. No man TAKETH it from Me, but I lay it down of Myself..." (John 10:17, 18). I am as guilty of His death as anyone else. He died for me. Why did Christ come to earth? To live? Or to die? "For even the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but...to give His life a ransom for many (Mark 10:45). A ransom is a price paid to free someone from captivity. Christ died to pay the full price of our sin to free us from our captivity to the satanic wages of our sin.

What do we lack? We lack righteousness. God is anxiously waiting to give us His righteousness. God gives His righteousness to whoever accepts Christ's payment for their sin...and He gives His righteousness the moment the person accepts Christ (II Cor. 5:21). The righteousness of God is given only by faith - never by works (Rom 4:5-8; 4:22-24; 9:30-32).

**PRESENTATION-** Since this is the heart of the gospel, you should carefully go over the verses teaching Christ paid for all sin. If the person does not accept the teaching of Scripture at first, reiterate trying to make the verses as clear to the person as you can.

We are pure and holy through His death.
- 9. (Rom. 4:25) Had Christ not fully paid for all sin, we could not receive justification and He would not have come back from the dead Since the payment for sin is death, He would still be in that grave. But Christ is risen from the dead, proving God is satisfied with the payment for sin that Christ made.

Who is guilty of His death? Jesus Himself told us no man TOOK His life. Listen to His words, "...I lay down My life, that I might take it again. - 3. John 1:12, "But as many as received Him, to them gave He power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on His Name." Salvation is always RECEIVING. To give or offer to Christ something for salvation is works for salvation.
- John 6:28.29, "Then said they unto Him, What shall we do, that we might work the works of God? Jesus answered and said unto them, This is the work of God, that ye believe on Him whom He hath sent." GOD did the work. God only asks of us that we believe on Christ.
- Philippians 3:9, "And be found in Him, not having mine own righteousness, which is of the law, but that which is through the faith of Christ, the righteousness which is of God by faith." You are found "in Christ" not by trying to get to heaven by your own righteousness, but by receiving Christ's righteousness by faith. God counts you righteous because of your faith not because of your works (Rom. 4:5).

- 1. Sympathize with them. Explain that what you want to talk about is not a religion. Do not insinuate that they are "stupid," etc. Remember, they do not know the truth. Sometimes it will be easier to lead to the Lord those who have rejected "religion," because at least they have recognized something was not "right" about what they had been taught.
- Compliment them on their insight. Agree with people wherever you can. Again the issue is between "grace and works." Until they see that Christ's death completely paid for their sin, they will not be ready to rely on that payment alone naturally. Keep showing them the verses, and get them to see that this is what God has to say about the matter.
- Sometimes a person will question your authority to speak on theological issues. Explain to him that it is not a question of his opinion versus yours. You are showing him what GOD has said. HE is the authority.

Before asking a person to trust Christ as his Saviour, it is always important to explain to him then that he can **know** he has eternal life from the moment he does believes.

#### **DOCTRINE - #7** Man can know he has eternal life. Eternal Life IS eternal.

- 1. (Rom. 6:23) "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is ETERNAL LIFE through Jesus Christ our Lord" Notice, the gift of God is ETERNAL LIFE-not, "life until you sin again," nor "life until you backslide."
- Notice what John 3:16 is saying, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish but have EVERLASTING LIFE." How long is EVERLASTING? Is it six months? Ten years? Does it start and stop? No! Everlasting life is FOR EVER AND EVER!
- God's gift is SALvation...not PRObation. God's gift is eternal life...not temporary life.
- John 6:47 "Verily, verily, I say unto you, he that believeth on Me hath EVERLASTING LIFE." "Hath everlasting life" is present tense. If you have EVERLASTING LIFE right now, you are safe forever. You do not wait until you die to receive everlasting life. You receive it the instant you trust Christ as your Saviour.
- I John 5:13, "These things have I written unto you that believe on the Name of the Son of God: that ye may know that ye have ETERNAL LIFE, and that ye may believe on the Name of the Son of God."

- 3. What if he took you into his boat, dried you off, fed you, took you ten miles from shore-and then threw you out again into the ocean? Would he be a Saviour? No! He would be as a "deceiver," a "probation officer."

The proper parent says, "Come on in!" and deals with the disobedient child. God never casts out His children! He has other ways to deal with them. **Heb. 12:5-10** 

- 1. Some would say, "All right, God won't cast me out, but I could get out of my own will and choice." The Lord anticipated such doubts and answers them clearly in **John 6:39**, It is God's will that no saved person would ever become lost. He says He will "lose nothing," and you are at least something!
- 2. On this point of not losing salvation, you will usually find that John 6:37 and 6:39 are sufficient. At times you might sense that certain cases require additional verses. Study the passages thoroughly so you will know which verses will best answer the need of the person.
  - a. **I Peter 1:4, 5**, Notice who is keeping our salvation . . . God Himself, by His own almighty power! And He is reserving place in heaven for us.
  - b. I Cor. 6:19, The Holy Spirit lives inside of every believer.
  - c. **John 14:16, 17** The Holy Spirit is in believers forever. If a saved person could go to hell, the Holy Spirit would have to go to hell, too.
  - d. **Eph. 1:13, 14** The Holy Spirit indwells every believer from the moment he trusts Christ as his Saviour for evermore. The term "earnest of our inheritance" is like when we make a "down payment on a house." It is a guarantee that the rest is coming later-now we have the new birth-later we will have our new body.
  - e. **I Cor. 12:27,** The moment you are saved, you become a member of the body of Christ. If you could ever become unsaved, part of Christ's own body would go to hell.

The Lord anticipated such doubts and answers them clearly in **John 6:39**, It is God's will that no saved person would ever become lost. He says He will "lose nothing," and you are at least something!
- 2. On this point of not losing salvation, you will usually find that John 6:37 and 6:39 are sufficient. At times you might sense that certain cases require additional verses. Study the passages thoroughly so you will know which verses will best answer the need of the person.
  - a. **I Peter 1:4, 5**, Notice who is keeping our salvation . . . God Himself, by His own almighty power! And He is reserving place in heaven for us.
  - b. I Cor. 6:19, The Holy Spirit lives inside of every believer.
  - c. **John 14:16, 17** The Holy Spirit is in believers forever. If a saved person could go to hell, the Holy Spirit would have to go to hell, too.
  - d. **Eph. 1:13, 14** The Holy Spirit indwells every believer from the moment he trusts Christ as his Saviour for evermore. The term "earnest of our inheritance" is like when we make a "down payment on a house." It is a guarantee that the rest is coming later-now we have the new birth-later we will have our new body.
  - e. **I Cor. 12:27,** The moment you are saved, you become a member of the body of Christ. If you could ever become unsaved, part of Christ's own body would go to hell.

1. **John 10:28**, "And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of My hand."

When you look up the word "never" in Strong's Concordance, you find that it comes from five different Greek words which are spelled in English: OU, ME, EIS, HO, and AION. The words OU and ME form a double negative meaning "Not at all, by no means, in no case, never." This double negative was used to state denials or prohibitions emphatically (Dana and Mantey, A Manual Grammar of the Greek New Testament, p. 266). The remaining three words combine to form an idiomatic expression meaning "forever" (The Englishman's Greek New Testament, p. 276). In the Greek, John 10:28 would read something like this: "And I give unto them eternal life and they shall not at all, by any means, male or female, in any case, forever perish."

- 2. Heb. 10:10, and Hebrews 10:14 tells us, "For by one offering He hath perfected forever them that are sanctified." Believers are sanctified, and Christ gives them the perfection they need to go to heaven. The word "sanctified" means to be made "holy, pure and blameless" (Strong's Concordance, Greek #37). He has made the believer holy and blameless and has given him a perfection which will last FOREVER.
- 3. **John 5:24**, Christ says those who have everlasting life (they already have it) shall not be condemned (promise for the future). Since God promises believers will not be condemned, why not take Him at His Word. They have already "PASSED from death unto life"!
- 4. **Philippians 3:9**, Christ's own righteousness is given to believers. Who would dare say Christ's righteousness isn't good enough for heaven?
- 5. Colossians 2:13 and Acts 13:39 say the believer is already justified and forgiven of all sins. So what sin could send you to hell? In fact, when Christ died on the cross for our sins, ALL our sins were future. Romans 8:28-39 teaches nothing can separate believers from God. HE justified us; nobody could charge a single thing against us! What a Saviour we have!
- 6. **I John 5:10~13** is as clear a passage as could be written. Christ's death on the cross does not do anything for you unless it gives you everlasting life. If you have Christ as your Saviour, you have this life. Anyone who doubts that God gives eternal life is calling God a liar.

"God is not a man, that He should lie . . . hath He said, and shall He not do it? Or hath He spoken, and shall He not make it good?" (**Numbers 23:19**) You will discover that when a person really understands the plan of salvation, he rarely will have a problem with "eternal security."

- 3. **John 5:24**, Christ says those who have everlasting life (they already have it) shall not be condemned (promise for the future). Since God promises believers will not be condemned, why not take Him at His Word. They have already "PASSED from death unto life"!
- 4. **Philippians 3:9**, Christ's own righteousness is given to believers. Who would dare say Christ's righteousness isn't good enough for heaven?
- 5. Colossians 2:13 and Acts 13:39 say the believer is already justified and forgiven of all sins. So what sin could send you to hell? In fact, when Christ died on the cross for our sins, ALL our sins were future. Romans 8:28-39 teaches nothing can separate believers from God. HE justified us; nobody could charge a single thing against us! What a Saviour we have!

- a. God does not guarantee **restoration of fellowship** on the basis of confession of sin. Fellowship with the Lord comes when a Christian disciplines his life so that he has "things in common" with the Lord.
- b. God does not guarantee **restoration of damage** resulting from sin on the basis of confession of sin. For instance, perhaps a Christian has gone away from things of the Lord and starts to drink, and he ruins his kidneys. If he confesses his sin, yes, the Lord will forgive him . . . but that forgiveness doesn't heal his damaged kidneys.

- b. Heb. 10:25, "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching". Also see Acts 15:4; Acts 20:7; Acts 21:18-20; and Galatians 6:1, 2.

It is the rare person who can withstand the pressures of his friends. You must make your friends the kind of Christian you aspire to be. Some of the most precious times in the lives of Christians have been where believers gathered together to share their needs and help one another through the encouragement of testimonies and the power of earnest, intercessory prayer. Encourage the new believer to attend a good, Bible-believing and teaching church.

- 2. Many times when a Christian is sound doctrinally and determined to witness, Satan will "sneak around the back door" and ruin that Christian's testimony because he wasn't CAREFUL. Scripture says,
  - a. I Pet. 5:8, "Be sober, be vigilant, because your adversary, the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may DEVOUR".
  - b. Eph. 6: 11, You will have to "Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil".
- 3. We should do what is proper in every situation because people will use our poor testimony to criticize Christian work. If people find that you lie, cheat, steal, speak in an uncouth manner, gossip, are inconsiderate of others, etc., you will not be liked, and you will do GREAT HARM to your ministry. People will look at your life and say, "If that is an example of Christianity, then I don't want it." This is so important! God warns us, II Cor. 6:3, "Giving no offense in any thing, that the MINISTRY be not blamed!"
- 4. Some things might be perfectly harmless for you to do, except that some Christians would consider it a poor testimony for one reason or another. You should consider if this is something you should abstain from.
  - a. I Thess. 5:22, The Lord cautions us to "Abstain from all appearance of evil".
  - b. I Cor. 8:8, Paul knew the meat was neither blessed nor cursed by the idol. But there were Christians who thought Paul should not eat that meat
  - c. Rom. 14:21, He said, "It is good neither to eat flesh, nor to drink wine, nor anything whereby thy brother stumbleth, or is offended, or is made weak" Could Paul have eaten meat? Yes. Did he? No.
  - d. I Cor. 8:13, "Wherefore, if meat make my brother to offend, I will eat no flesh while the world standeth, lest I make my brother to offend". In Christian work you should not purposefully offend people... and neither can you let yourself be offended. If you allow people to hurt your feelings, you will not be able to have the ministry with them in their lives that you need to have.

Some Christians get so introspective that they spend all their time trying to be "holy," spend hours in "prayer and meditation," <u>but neglect to tell the lost about Christ.</u> They live "good lives" before others, but no one ever hears the gospel from their lips.
  - c. If you live a good life but don't witness, you will get all the glory instead of Christ, to whom all glory belongs (I Cor. 1:31).

### 1. If you want to be a great soulwinner, you must be a great servant.

- Mark 10:43, "... whosoever will be great among you, shall be your MINISTER".
- b. I Cor. 9:1 and 19, The Apostle Paul is a wonderful example of a really dedicated Christian. Listen to his own words in. "Am I not an apostle? Am I not free? Have I not seen Jesus Christ our Lord? <u>Are not ye my work in the Lord?</u> For though I be free from all men, yet have I made myself servant unto all, that I might gain the more."

### 2. If you want to be a great soulwinner, you must be make great sacrifices.

- a. Acts 20:20, 21, 31, Do you realize the extent of the dedication of the Apostle Paul? Yes, he witnessed night and day for three years straight, publicly and privately. But what was he willing to give up to lead a soul to Christ? Money? Position? Spare time? Sports? Home? Health? Life itself?
- b. I Thess. 2:8, Did you know that he was willing to have given his OWN SOUL that others could be saved? tells us, "So being affectionately desirous of you, we were willing to have imparted unto you, not the gospel of God only, but also OUR OWN SOULS, because ye were dear unto us."
- c. Romans 9:3, Paul cared so much for souls that he was willing, if it were possible even to go to hell himself, if that would help his fellow Jews to be saved.
- d. Hebrews 12:1, says to "lay aside every weight." Some things aren't even a poor testimony in themselves, but they "bog" you down, they are "weights," they take up valuable time which you should be using for the Lord.
- e. II Tim. 2:4, "No man that warreth entangles himself with the affairs of this life, that he may please Him who hath chosen him to be a soldier". Your life can become filled with so many "good" things of this life that you haven't the time to do much for Christ.

### 3. If you want to be a great soulwinner, you must live by schedule.

No one can tell you how to run your life . . . what to include in your chedule, and what to leave out. You could probably rationalize and excuse any activity which you really wanted to do. But between you and the Lord you must decide what is best for your service to Him. Your time is your life. You do not know how much you have. How you spend your time each day will determine the total worth of your life. If your life is made up largely of sports, money, pleasure, television, clubs, etc., then your life will come and go-and not much will be accomplished for Christ in it.

## The Messenger's Testimony

### 1. If you want to be a great soulwinner, you must be a great servant.

- Mark 10:43, "... whosoever will be great among you, shall be your MINISTER".
- b. I Cor. 9:1 and 19, The Apostle Paul is a wonderful example of a really dedicated Christian. Listen to his own words in. "Am I not an apostle? Am I not free? Have I not seen Jesus Christ our Lord? Are not ye my work in the Lord? For though I be free from all men, yet have I made myself servant unto all, that I might gain the more."

### 2. If you want to be a great soulwinner, you must be make great sacrifices.

- a. Acts 20:20, 21, 31, Do you realize the extent of the dedication of the Apostle Paul? Yes, he witnessed night and day for three years straight, publicly and privately. But what was he willing to give up to lead a soul to Christ? Money? Position? Spare time? Sports? Home? Health? Life itself?
- b. I Thess. 2:8, Did you know that he was willing to have given his OWN SOUL that others could be saved? tells us, "So being affectionately desirous of you, we were willing to have imparted unto you, not the gospel of God only, but also OUR OWN SOULS, because ye were dear unto us."
- c. Romans 9:3, Paul cared so much for souls that he was willing, if it were possible even to go to hell himself, if that would help his fellow Jews to be saved.
- d. Hebrews 12:1, says to "lay aside every weight." Some things aren't even a poor testimony in themselves, but they "bog" you down, they are "weights," they take up valuable time which you should be using for the Lord.
- e. II Tim. 2:4, "No man that warreth entangles himself with the affairs of this life, that he may please Him who hath chosen him to be a soldier". Your life can become filled with so many "good" things of this life that you haven't the time to do much for Christ.

### 3. If you want to be a great soulwinner, you must live by schedule.

No one can tell you how to run your life . . . what to include in your chedule, and what to leave out. You could probably rationalize and excuse any activity which you really wanted to do. But between you and the Lord you must decide what is best for your service to Him. Your time is your life. You do not know how much you have. How you spend your time each day will determine the total worth of your life. If your life is made up largely of sports, money, pleasure, television, clubs, etc., then your life will come and go-and not much will be accomplished for Christ in it.

# 1. The Value of the Scriptures

- a. Psalm 138:2, God exalts His Word even above His own Name (). With such high recommendation from God Himself, we certainly should know the Bible WELL, for our own personal comfort and exhortation and to bring the gospel message to the lost.
- b. II Tim. 3: 15, "... the holy Scriptures ... are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus."
- Rom. 10:17, "So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God".

## 2. The Vision from the Scriptures (Desire is Vision)

- a. Proverbs 29:18, Where *there is* no **vision**, the people perish: but he that keepeth the law, happy *is* he.
- b. II Tim. 2:15, "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the Word of truth". **You must envision God using you**.
- c. I Peter 2:2, "As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the Word, that ye may GROW thereby". **You must desire a vision of growth**. Yes, it is possible to win souls with very little knowledge of Scripture. A baby is not expected to have the knowledge of a college graduate. But when a baby remains infantile all his life, it is certainly a great tragedy.
- d. I Pet. 3: 15, God says, Those who **desire** to be FRUITFUL soulwinners should be "ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh (him) a reason of the hope that is in (him) . . .".

# 3. The Victory through the Scriptures

- a. Rom. 1:15, Paul said he was "... READY to preach the gospel...". The key to victory is being prepared. To preach the gospel in such a way that will answer people's questions will require that you spend time MEMORIZING Scriptures and studying thoroughly the passages which answer people's questions.
- b. Hebrews 4:12, GOD'S WORD IS POWER! Knowledge of God's Word is your greatest "weapon" in witnessing. "For the Word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, ...."

- a. I Cor. 2:4, 5, The Apostle Paul was highly educated by the finest instructors of his day, and yet he said, "My speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of MAN'S wisdom, ... that your faith should not stand in the wisdom of men, but in the power of GOD".
- b. II Cor. 11:3, Paul was concerned that his children in the faith might not always keep their message simple, and warned them of Satan's tactics, "But I fear, lest by any means, as the serpent beguiled Eve through his SUBTILTY, so your minds should be corrupted from the simplicity that is in Christ".

Satan won't say to you, "Hello, this is Satan, please complicate the gospel by using technical words, or having a philosophical discussion, or by adding man's good works for salvation." NOT AT ALL! Satan comes in with a sweet, quiet voice and might say, "Look, this person is a very moral, intelligent, up-to-date citizen. If you start talking to him about the Bible, sin, Jesus' blood, and having faith, etc., he will think you are absolutely NUTS."
