TEXT: Rom. 4:13-25 (This portion of scripture teaches why justification was not, and cannot, be by the law).

- I. Why Justification was not by the law. Rom. 4:13-15
 - a. God promised Abraham that he would be the heir of the world was through the righteousness of faith, 430 years before the law was given. Gal. 3:8, 17
 - b. If justification was by the law : (Rom. 4:14)
 - 1. Faith is made void
 - 2. Promise made of none effect
 - 3. It would benefit only the Jew
 - c. The law worketh wrath (Rom. 4:15) There is the death penalty upon all who do not keep it perfectly, therefore condemning all and saving none.

II. Why Justification *is* by faith

- a. That it might be by Grace (Rom. 4:16)
- b. That it might be Sure (ETERNALLY SECURE) to all (Rom. 4:16)
- c. That God might fulfill his promises made to Abraham (Rom. 4:17)
- **III.** Why Justification <u>was</u> by faith

Rom. 4:19-22

Rom.4:16-18

- a. Abraham was not *weak in faith* (Rom. 4:19-20)
 - 1. considered not his own body now dead
 - 2. considered not the deadness of Sarah's womb
 - 3. staggered not through unbelief
- b. Abraham was *strong in faith* (Rom. 4:20-21)
 - 1. giving glory to God (what it is all about)
 - 2. fully persuaded God would perform what He had promised
- IV. Why Justification *shall be* by faith Rom. 4:23-25
 - a. Righteousness was not imputed unto Abraham for his sake alone.
 - b. Righteousness shall be imputed unto us also, if we believe.
 - c. Christ was delivered as the payment for our offenses (sins).
 - d. Christ was raised from the dead to justify those who believe .

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
