A Charge to our new Senior Pastor

Introduction: God's Word gives a threefold charge to the preacher.

1. Take heed unto "thyself".

1Ti 4:16 Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee.

a. The pastor is to be a man of prayer

Act 6:4 But we will give ourselves **continually to prayer**, and to the ministry of the word.

b. The pastor is to be a man of purity

1Ti 5:22 Lay hands suddenly on no man, neither be partaker of other men's sins: **keep thyself pure**.

Isa 52:11 be ye clean, that bear the vessels of the LORD.

2Ti 2:21 If a man therefore **purge himself** from these, he shall be a vessel unto honour, sanctified, and meet for the master's use, *and* **prepared** unto every good work.

2Ti 3:12 Yea, and all that will **live godly** in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution.

2Ti 3:14 **But continue thou** in the things which thou hast learned and hast been assured of, knowing of whom thou hast learned *them;*

2Ti 3:15 And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus.

2Ti 3:16 All scripture *is* given by inspiration of God, and *is* profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness:

2Ti 3:17 That the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works.

2. Take heed unto... "The Doctrine".

a. Sound Doctrine

Tit 2:1 But speak thou the things which become sound doctrine: (Do things that are becoming to a Christian).

b. Profitable Doctrine

Act 20:20 And how I kept back nothing that was profitable unto you, but have shewed you, and have taught you publickly, and from house to house,

c. Complete Doctrine

Act 20:27 For I have not shunned to declare unto you all the counsel of God.

2Ti 4:1 I charge *thee* therefore before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, who shall judge the quick and the dead at his appearing and his kingdom;

2Ti 4:2 Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine.

2Ti 4:3 For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears;

2Ti 4:4 And they shall turn away *their* ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables.

2Ti 4:5 But watch thou in all things, endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, make **full proof** of thy ministry. (leave no doubts about your commitment to this ministry)

3. Take heed unto "All the Flock"

Act 20:28 Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and **to all the flock**, over the which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers, to feed the church of God, which he hath purchased with his own blood.

a. Feed the Flock of God

Jesus told Peter, "Feed my **Lambs**", and twice to "Feed my **Sheep**" Feed the young and the old. (John 21:15-17)

1Pe 5:2 **Feed the flock of God** which is among you, taking the oversight *thereof,* not by constraint, but willingly; not for filthy lucre, but of a ready mind;

b. Lead them

1Pe 5:3 Neither as being lords over *God's* heritage, but **being ensamples to the flock.**

c. Love them

A preacher should love his people. Paul wrote to the Thessalonians:

1Th 2:8 So being <u>affectionately desirous of you</u>, we were willing to have imparted unto you, not the gospel of God only, but also our own souls, **because ye were dear unto us**.

- d. Warn the flock
 - i. About wolves:

<u>Act 20:31</u> Therefore watch, and remember, that by the space of three years I ceased not to warn every one night and day with tears. <u>About doing the wrong things</u>

- ii. <u>1Co 4:14</u> I write not these things to shame you, but as my beloved sons I warn you.
- iii. About not doing the right things

<u>1Th 5:14</u> Now we exhort you, brethren, warn them that are unruly, comfort the feebleminded, support the weak, be patient toward all *men*.
