Only Jehoahaz was left. 2Ch 21:16 Moreover the LORD stirred up against Jehoram the spirit of the Philistines, and of the Arabians, that were near the Ethiopians: 2Ch 21:17 And they came up into Judah, and brake into it, and carried away all the

substance that was found in the king's house, and his sons also, and his wives; so that there was never a son left him, save Jehoahaz, the youngest of his sons.

One left. 2Ch 22:10 But when Athaliah the mother of Ahaziah saw that her son was dead, she arose and destroyed all the seed royal of the house of Judah.

2Ch 22:11 But Jehoshabeath, the daughter of the king, took Joash the son of Ahaziah, and stole him from among the king's sons that were slain, and put him and his nurse in a bedchamber. 2Ch 22:12 And he was with them hid in the house of God six years:

2Ki 21:1 Manasseh was twelve years old when he began to reign, and reigned fifty and five years in Jerusalem. He was born three years after his dad, Hezekiah, was to have died. You see why God gave him an extra 15 years?

Notice the timing of this decree. A woman who is great with child must either walk or ride close to 100 miles. I don't believe it's just a coincidence. Luk 2:3 And all went to be taxed, every one into his own city. Luk 2:4 And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, **into Judaea**, unto the city of David, which is called Bethlehem; (because he was of the house and lineage of David:)

Satan used King Herod to stab at one baby. Mat 2:16 Then Herod, when he saw that he was mocked of the wise men, was exceeding wroth, and sent forth, and slew all the children that were in Bethlehem, and in all the coasts thereof, from two years old and under, according to the time which he had diligently enquired of the wise men.

Satan dogged the son of God for 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ years and used every means available to kill the promised seed.
