Answer Key:

1. B – "For He hath made Him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in Him" (2 Cor. 5:21).
2. B – Isaiah 53:6 clearly states that God laid on Christ the iniquity of us all.
3. B – Christ's one offering perfected forever those who are sanctified (Heb. 10:10,14). His payment was complete.
4. B – Christ's resurrection proves God accepted the full payment for sin (Rom. 4:25).
5. A – All a person must do is believe Jesus paid for all their sin and receive Him as Saviour.
6. B – "This is the work of God, that ye believe on Him whom He hath sent" (John 6:29).

7. A – Salvation is by grace through faith... not of works, lest any man should boast (Eph. 2:8-9).

8. B – God’s gift is eternal life, not probation or temporary life (Rom. 6:23; John 3:16).

9. B – “That ye may know that ye have eternal life” (1 John 5:13).

10. B – “Jesus” means “the eternal, self-existent God who saves and keeps.”
