Answer Key:

1. B – “Because sentence against an evil work is not executed speedily” (Eccl. 8:11). There is often a delay between sin and its consequences.

2. B – “To Me belongeth vengeance, and recompense; their foot shall slide in due time” (Deut. 32:35).

3. B – Moses had “respect unto the recompense of the reward.”

4. B – Believers appear before the Judgment Seat of Christ to receive reward (or loss of reward) for things done in the body, whether good or bad. Salvation is not in question.

5. B – “Every man shall receive his own reward according to his own labour” (1 Cor. 3:8).

6. B – The Lord keeps accurate records; you will be rewarded for what you actually did.

7. A – Study your Bible (God talks to you), Prayer (you talk to God), Meet with other Christians, and Witnessing (you talk to unbelievers).

8. A – “As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the Word, that ye may grow thereby” (1 Pet. 2:2).

9. B – Prayer is natural conversation with our Heavenly Father (“Abba” – Daddy).

10. B – A new Christian’s fresh testimony is powerful, and every believer is an ambassador for Christ with the responsibility to tell others.
